LIVING THE LITURGY

<u>Now is the TESTING Time!</u> The "Holy Week" of Jesus's life is when he "can't not" confront further the religion and culture up to that point in human evolution. Hi loving obedience to the Father's actual ways leads him, as the other great prophets had, to take the truth into the heart, the centre, the core —

- of Jerusalem, the city and temple of God's chosen people
- of the world's politics, power and inequalities
- of any person who would open to welcome him in

This is the culmination and climax of what we begun in the wilderness temptationsthe trials and testing from his Baptism onwards lead him to face even fuller trials in Gethsemane, the Roman courts, the religion of his time and his Passion. He proves triumphant through continuous humility, and faithful loving in hostile circumstances. **What we began** at the start of Lent has led us to this week in the liturgy –

- ❖ what will heklp you make it the Holy Week? How will you plan your time?
- though distanced we share communally in trials and testings in the CVera
- what do you ask God for this Easter: for yourself, our church, the world?

The promise of Jesus at the Ash Wednesday liturgy was:

".....pray... fast... give in secret...and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you...."

Who would have thought that those words wuld be so shockingly true this year because of social distancing, closing of churches and the stay at home regulations!

SYNODING AND CORANAVIRUS CRISIS MAKING CHANGES

How are you getting on?

The whole world is forced to live through this crisis: the chinese character for "crisis" includes the two aspects of DANGER but also OPPORTUNITY.

The dangers are obvious, much more pressing and threatening for some than for others, and we must find new ways to keep in touch, support each other and find fresh ways of sharing solidarity. What is happening to you.....? If you want to talk, do phone Fr Tony in the parish office? Some parishioners have also volunteered to help out or contact fellow parishioners if anyone would wish.

What is essential now for us in our faith and prayer?

Changes have been forced on us, and we can develop ways of changing. It is extreme God knows, but CV is still part of our Church's time of seeking fresh vision from God in the Synod 2020! Suffering is part of the demands of renewal and opportunity – what do you think we can learn from all this, about "becoming the church God is calling us to be"?

How can we communicate these days?
