LIVING THE WORD AND THE LITURGY

Christ has come - Christ is coming - Christ will come in Glory

Again Advent comes around, and leads us off to repeat the yearly cycle of Scriptures from the Lectionary and the Sundays of the Liturgy. This is the New Year Starting in Church time, so Happy New Year – sort of.

The Lectionary for this Year on Sundays is Year B, and during the weekdays is Year 1.

The predominant Gospel in Ordinary time this year is the Gospel of Mark.

Again Advent is the season which completes, this Sunday, the looking ahead of Christians with faith, to the coming in Glory of Christ Risen and Ascended at the completion of God's Creative work in the Cosmos, our Universe, Planet Earth and our lives. It may be we meet with God in the completion of our personal lives before the completion of the whole, so Advent is about approaching the meeting with God, face to face, facing death if that comes first.

Also Advent of course is remembering the beginning of the life of Jesus, God's coming to us as human, the start of the Christian Era of history with the first Christmas. Our preparing for the celebration of this coming during Advent time might ponder our sharing in the waiting of the pregnant Mary, the dreams of Joseph to be guided by God in crisis. May it be a time of hoping that the approach of God to us this Christmas will bring us closer to God's love, Christ's peace, the Spirit's joy.

CATHOLIC LIFE NATIONALLY

The government permission for our churches to return to gathering again for public, communal worship is conditional again on our ensuring safety with our strict protections and procedures. So all priests and people must stick to the guidelines of 5th Nov.

Also, the Bishops' Conference have engaged the officials in the government with a call for evidence when they seek to restrict the rights of religious practice in our country, and together the State and the Church have embarked on the Faith Engagement Review:

- There was a strong ask from the officials of the government for individual Catholics to respond to this open consultation on the way Government engages with faith communities.

• This call for evidence opened on 13th Nov and will close at 11:45pm on 11th Dec 2020.

This consultation is a very rare and valuable opportunity for Catholic citizens, other Christians and people of other Religions, to express to our elected government what is precious and important to us in the public practice of our religion. It is a polite, but challenging, request for sound reasons for any restrictions of these practices.

 The Catholic Union with Catholic Voices are holding a webinar on "how the government should engage with faith groups" on Wednesday 2nd December at 7pm. Colin Bloom, the Faith Engagement Adviser at the Ministry for Housing, Communities & Local Government, will present and promote the government consultation on the issue.

CATHOLIC LIFE ARCHDIOCESE

SYNOD 2020 continues towards the assembly on 19th June '21; and on Monday 7th Dec '20, the Members of the Synod will submit their preferred options from the affirmations and proposals that have been debated these past weeks. **The Archdiocesan Offices and Employees – LACE** – is in crisis, so our Trustees have decided with regret to close the centre at LACE, and restructure the roles and departments for future service. Many of the 44 LACE employees are facing redundancy or redeployment with revised job specifications. Do spare a prayer for them, and the burdens of decision on the Archbishop's Council for such suffering at this terrible time.

CATHOLIC LIFE SOUTHPORT

Christ the King High School celebrated the feast day virtually, have participated with great recognition and praise in Ofsted's evaluation and research about learning and security in Covid practice. Governors are meeting to sustain the creative and hard work of Erin Wheeler the head and the staff.

Southport Hospital and Hospice are of course working so hard under severe strains, and Fr Kevin McLoughlin the new Catholic chaplain from Holy Family is well into the stride, liaising with the whole chaplaincy team.
