<u>Readings for the weekend - Reflecting on the Word of God</u>

First Reading – Acts 15:1-2,22-29.

A big issue for the early Church was how much of the Law and the traditions of Moses should be imposed on those becoming new members of the Church. This is how the problem was solved.



Second Reading – Revelations 21:10-14,22-23.

We are given a majestic picture of the new Jerusalem, the Heavenly Church of the future, when God's Kingdom will come in all its glory.

<u>Gospel Reading – John 14:23-29.</u>

We hear part of Jesus' discourse at the Last Supper. It is dominated by news of his imminent departure from the disciples, which we celebrate on the Feast of the Ascension this week.

Scripture Reflection.

Many people from outside the Jewish community accepted Christianity as a result of the preaching of Paul and Barnabas. But then a question arose: how much of the Law and the traditions of Moses should these converts have to accept and live by? At first, there were great divisions on this issue. Eventually everyone agreed that the new converts need not adhere to everything – and so, instead of becoming a Jewish sect, Christianity became a universal religion. The Gospel concerns Jesus' departure from his followers. He is concerned to assure his disciples that he would not leave them orphans. Despite his leaving, he and they will not be apart. If they keep his Word, they will be drawn into the love of the Father and the Son. By being part of his Church today, we are part of this love, a love that will never end. **Pentecost Service**: Please try your very best to come along to the Pentecost Service outside **Ainsdale Village Church** on **Sunday June 8th at 2pm**. The service is an act of witness, as the different Christian churches from the area come together, as the apostles did at Pentecost, and celebrate God's presence among us. The service should only last 20-30 minutes or so, but we are going to have a "Bring to the table" afterwards. If you can bring some food and nibbles, please do so, and let us come together to celebrate Pentecost Day as Christians in God's love

Installation of Archbishop John Sherrington: This week we will be celebrating the Installation of our new Archbishop, John Sherrington. The Installation Mass takes place in the Cathedral at 12noon on Tuesday – please note that there will be no Mass in the Parish that day since Bishop John, and Frs. Leo and Paul have got to set off early to get a place there. Please keep Archbishop John in your prayers. Hopefully we might get him to come over to Ainsdale very soon.

Lourdes Prayer Initiative: Every Deanery has been given a lantern that will be placed before the altar at our weekend Masses. The Lantern should be with us in the next couple of weeks. People will be invited to place any petitions for the Lourdes Pilgrimage into the basket. These petitions will be taken to Lourdes, during the Archdiocesan Pilgrimage this summer, and placed at the Grotto where Our Ladv appeared to St. Bernadette.

Feast of the Ascension of the Lord: Please note that Thursday is the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, that time when Jesus, after his Resurrection and spending time with his disciples and friends, ascended to God the Father in Heaven. On this feast day we celebrate the great love of God in giving us his Son as our Saviour. By going back to the Father in Heaven, Jesus became the mediator between God and his people. The feast should fill us with the hope that one day we too will be taken up to Heaven by God, who revealed his great love for us in the person of Jesus.

However, ideally, we do hope that they can come to ALL three of the preparation meetings along with the rehearsal which we will let you know about as soon as we can.

There are only 3 priests in the area who are regularly "on call" for the hospital now, so, if you go to hospital, it may not always be possible to contact a priest.
