Readings for the weekend - Reflecting on the Word of God

First Reading - Acts 2:1-11.

Luke describes the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles, and the effect it had on them.



Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 12:3-7,12-13.

The Holy Spirit gives different gifts to different people, for the good of the Church, the Body of Christ

Gospel Reading - John 20:19-23.

The Risen Jesus gives the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples and presents to them the mission of the Church.

Scripture Reflection.

Jewish tradition saw Pentecost as the feast of the giving of the Law on Mount Sinai. According to legend, a mighty wind turned to fire and voice proclaimed the Law. In a further refinement of the story, the fire split into several tongues corresponding to the seventy nations of the world, to convey the idea that the law was for everyone, for the whole world.

Luke makes use of this story. He, too, has a mighty wind and tongues of fire coming down on the disciples. But for Luke the universal proclamation was not of the Law, but of the Good News. In his Gospel John depicts the blessing of the Holy Spirit taking place on Easter Day. Although this may sound like Luke and John are in some disagreement, they are really sharing the same story. In John's Gospel the Risen Jesus gives the gift of the Spirit and commissions the missions of the Church. In Luke, Pentecost is the day when the disciples, and all Jesus followers, are blest with the gifts of God's Holy Spirit.

<u>Pentecost Service</u>: Please try your very best to come along to the Pentecost Service outside **Ainsdale Village Church** this **Sunday.** The service is an act of witness, as the different Christian churches from the area come together, as the apostles did at Pentecost, and celebrate God's presence among us. The service should only last 20-30 minutes or so. All welcome. Please pray for good weather!

Deanery Pastoral Plan: On Wednesday this week the Deanery Synodal Council met with each other for the first time for a few months to look at the Deanery Pastoral Plan which, we were informed about a few weeks ago. At present the plan is to formulate all the data we have for each Parish in the Deanery. Then in September the process will begin at looking at the whole Deanery, with the information at hand, to think about how we can move forward as Churches and Parishes together. We are hoping that, from September onwards, the process will be more open to more people, so we will keep you informed as much as possible about how the process is taking shape.
